

SVB Award Winners Get Long-Awaited Night in the Spotlight

SVB's Annual Awards program recognizes our most exceptional team members for the work they've done to serve our organization, our clients and their communities through their expertise, responsiveness, and resiliency, while exemplifying SVB Values.

On the night of September 29, after two years of COVID-19 related postponements, the wait was finally over and 33 SVBers accepted their awards for the 2019, 2020 and 2021 Innovation Award, the Peggy Bork Client Care Award and the Bill Biggerstaff Award.

The 2019, 2020 and 2021 Community Service, Core Values and Operational Excellence Awards were presented at an earlier ceremony that took place on May 26, 2022. Read a recap of that evening here.

The gala once again took place at the Ritz Carlton in scenic Half Moon Bay, California, kicking off with a Welcome Reception and Gallery Walk for award recipients, their guests and Executive Committee members.

Presenting the SVB Innovation Awards, whose recipients are selected by a diverse group of peers, Chief Marketing and Strategy Officer Michelle Draper said "Each of these individuals brings a passion to their work every day. Where others see problems and get discouraged, they see possibilities and solutions. They have big ideas ... AND they have follow-through. Their impact is real and lasting, noticed not just by a few people, but by everyone."

Then, the festive crowd made their way into the ballroom for the awards dinner itself, hosted by SVB Awards program co-chairs Head of ADP Rachel Phillips and Head of Internal Communications Brendan Smith-Bentley.

In his welcoming remarks, SVB CEO Greg Becker commented, "There were times over

these last few years that it was hard to imagine us being able to be together. Tonight is about celebrating those people who contribute so much to SVB's culture and who propel the success of our company, and most importantly, our clients"

Winners of the Peggy Bork Client Care Award are selected by their peers and are our clients' greatest allies and advocates. Presenting the awards, Silicon Valley Bank President Mike Descheneaux remarked, "Our people remain our primary differentiator. So many of our clients – our new clients, our longtime clients, our repeat clients who keep coming back – value the relationship they have with SVB above just about everything else."

Summarizing "the ingredients to our secret sauce" that these honorees bring to their work, Mike said, "Our winners tonight have a high emotional IQ. They put in the work to understand our clients. They celebrate their successes. They share in the disappointment. And they make every client feel like the most important client."

The final honorees of the night were the recipients of the Bill Biggerstaff Award, which is one of the highest honors an SBVer can get – our version of a lifetime achievement award.

Presenting the Bill Biggerstaff Award, Chief Credit Officer Marc Cadieux noted, "This award is different from any other award at SVB, in that its winners are nominated and selected by the Executive Committee. A winner of the Biggerstaff award is someone who has delivered a consistent and elevated body of work in the right way – the SVB way.

"The Bill Biggerstaff award is the highest honor the bank can bestow on one of its employees. It's not just about what you do here at SVB or for how long. It's more. It's about HOW you've been doing it."
